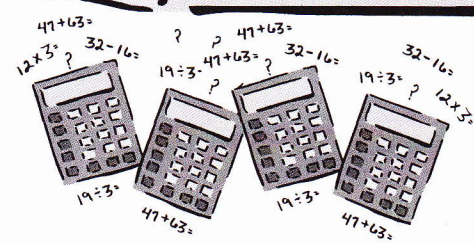
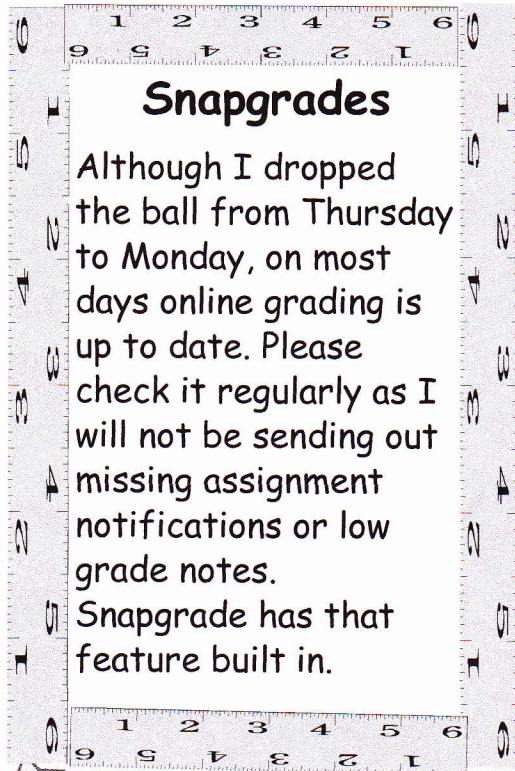
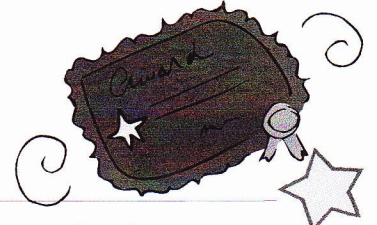

Classroom Economy



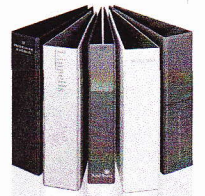
Snapgrades
